KHALIL ASKS KUTKM TO PRODUCE EASILY ACCEPTED GRADUATES

MELAKA, July 30 (Bernama) -- Tun Mohd Khalil Yaakob, who was made Chancellor of the Kolej Universiti Teknikal Kebangsaan Malaysia (KUTKM) today, has asked the university college to produce graduates who will be easily accepted by employers.

Mohd Khalil, who is the Melaka Yang Dipertua Negeri, also said KUTKM graduates must also prove to all parties that they were among the best being churned out by universities in the country.

The Chancellor's Awards were given to Rahim Selamat and Eugene Lee, who graduated with the Bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering.
